Fellow Arrowmen,

This year at the Northern California Jamboree the W3N and W3S Sections will be hosting an Order of the Arrow Village open to all Jamboree participants. This OA Indian Village will have multiple program areas that will be fun for all ages of Scouts and Cubs as well as give some information about the Order of the Arrow and what we do.

We need YOUR help!

We are looking for OA staff to help out during the week at our various program areas:

Craft: During all program hours, we will be offering participants the opportunity to build their own decorative feather drop using turkey feathers. Staff members in this area will be facilitating the building of these projects during open program times. We could have up to 50 participants at a time and need staff to ensure that participants get the guidance (if needed) to build their craft. We need about 5-8 people here at any one time.

OA Information Booth: During all program hours, Staff in this program area will have flyers and literature available to interested Scouts and Scouters. The literature will include: OA info, election info, High Adventure Camps, Council Camps and Conclave info. We need 2-3 people at any one time.

Cub Scout Program: On Saturday morning, we will be offering interested Dens and Packs the ability to complete the Bear Requirement: Tall Tales, at this program area. Staff here will dress in regalia and tell both Native American and American cultural folk tales. As part of the Bear requirement the Cubs must point out where this story took place on a U.S. map. We need 4 teams of 3 that can work the same times and rotate on/off.

Exhibits: On Friday during program time and again on Saturday and Sunday mornings we will have an area open near our Pow-wow area where we will display actual dance outfits, articles of clothing, pieces of culture, dance pieces, etc. Staff here will be available to offer insight on the different styles popular in the U.S. and discuss the different parts of a dance outfit participants who are interested, as well as the many questions that will be asked about specific pieces displayed. We need lots of good exhibits and staff to help keep the area secure.

Assistance Volunteers: We will need people, especially on Friday from around 10:00am-5:00pm and again Saturday morning to help transport gear from nearby parking lots to the Indian Village location. We will have some hand-trucks and wagons to help haul, but need your muscle to make it happen! We can use about 10 people during this time.
